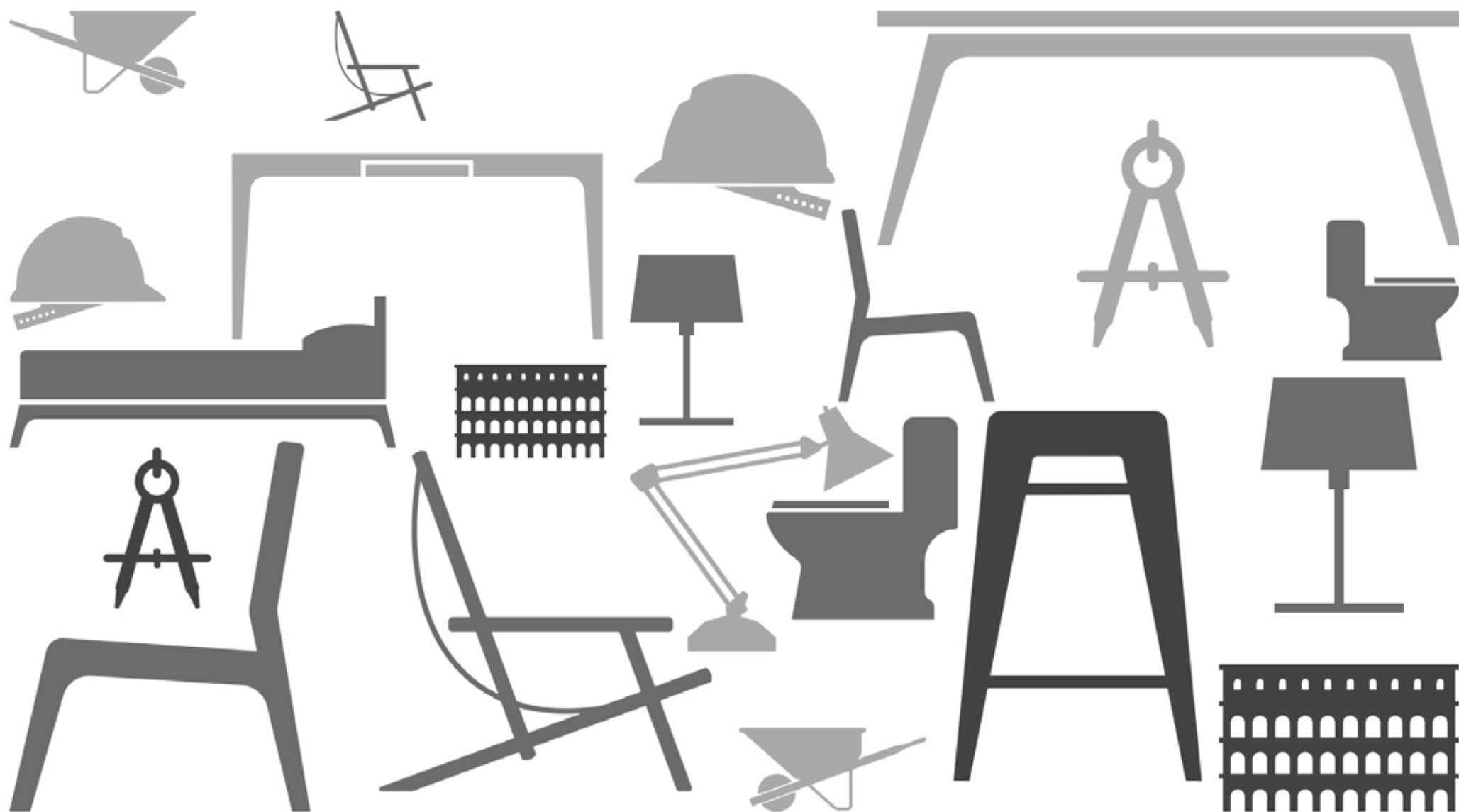

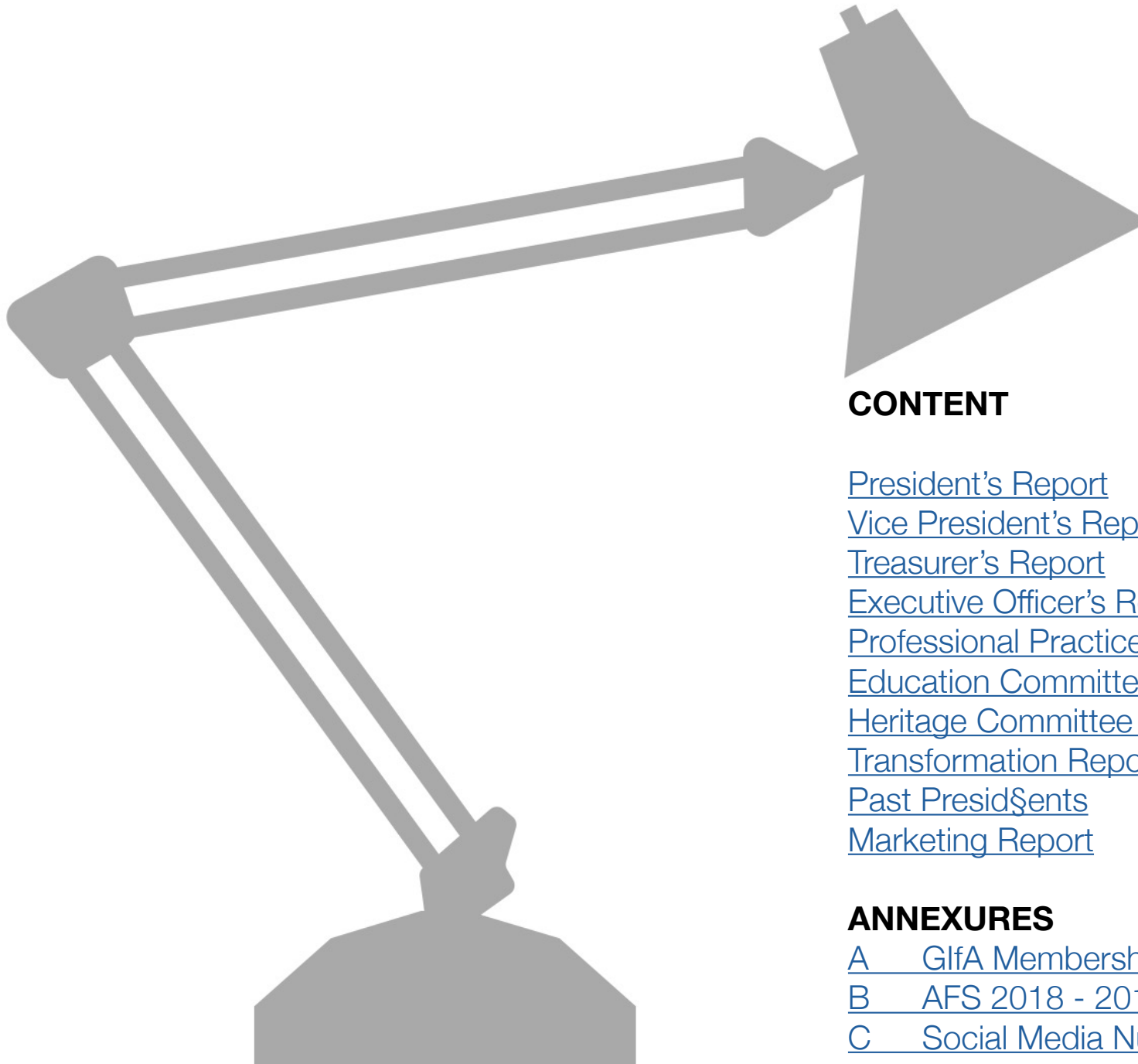

NOTE FROM THE PRESIDENT



This year has brought to the fore critical issues around gender equality within our industry and particularly around the role of women in the built environment. These are by no means new issues.

As we all trod along steadily with our daily focus on making good architecture, every few years a matter arises which thrusts us right into the thick of things.

In July 2018, comments made by the former CEO of SAICE, Manglin Pillay, in an article written for Civil Engineering Magazine, sparked outrage amongst the engineering fraternity but also amongst related professions, such as our own. Pillay stated that women earn less due to their “appetite for workload” and insinuated that it was not a good idea to invest in female engineers. In September he was removed from the CEO position, mainly from the pressures exercised by female members of the engineering body. While one may find it hard to fathom that these prejudices still exist, it is more troubling to hear stories of similar discrimination within our own profession. And to

consider that too often these stories are not heard at all.

The above mentioned events enabled an open discussion within our SAIA Transformation committee. Personally this created a platform – for the first time in my career – for me to speak openly about my own experience, not only as a woman but as a black woman in this industry. Though daunting at first, through dialogue, one begins to erode the barriers of separation. That lead me to ask the question, ‘Why don’t we have the platform for free debate and the opportunity to share our experiences within GIFA?’ There is so much that could be shared and learnt, be it on a practice level between micro and macro practices, or through women sharing their experiences in the workplace or through discussions with veterans in our profession.



While we strive for a GIFA which is more open and welcoming to all diverse peoples, I am proud to be leading this institute which is the strongest VA in the country. I must acknowledge the exceptional work being done by all GIFA committees. They are the backbone of the organization and have taken the challenge to keep GIFA strong and relevant in a challenging economic environment. The Heritage committee, chaired by Sue Zenha have given invaluable inputs on a number of projects and member queries, while our professional practice committee, chaired by my VP, Krynauw Nel has had one of the busiest and challenging years. The recent developments at SACAP have been largely brought about by this committee's initiatives, together with A4C. We express our gratitude to them. Our Marketing committee, chaired by Daniel van der Merwe, is taking exciting steps to shake up the way we have traditionally looked at GIFA marketing and I am confident that this will lead to a more sustainable GIFA.

Thank you all the committees for the amazing work and continued support!

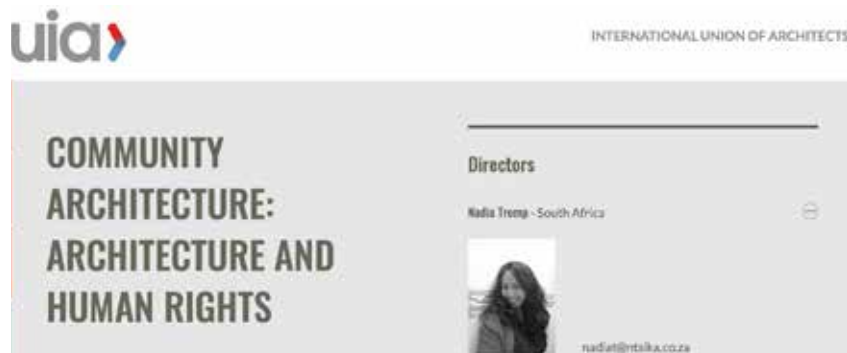
GIFA OBJECTIVES

- To organise and unite in fellowship the architects of Gauteng: As a region of SAIA we continuously culminate an environment of fellowship and unity amongst our members in the region. Our professional breakfast which we initiated in 2014 has rippled into the various SAIA regions influencing unity beyond our territory. We continue to grow the attendance of this fellowship. We celebrated our female architects in women's month with a professional breakfast focussing on the struggle for liberation in South Africa. These incredible architects and urban designers included recent graduates, SAIA Award winners, authors, professors and curators.
- High standards of conduct, professional competence and integrity: GIFA in our effort to practice professionally with high standard of conduct, competency and integrity has advocated in issues of National interest. We proceed to remain relevant as a public benefits organisation in areas of public interest being the voice to the voiceless.
- Art, Science, Research and practice of architecture: This year GIFA launched it's engagement with Sci-Bono Discovery Centre, participating in the

Careers Day for Grade 9s, with the focus being on Smart Cities and the Future of Work. Our members were invited to present talks around these topics and to engage with students from all backgrounds.

- Our Edcom is deliberating over the possibilities of mediating a Research Hub. This idea was recently introduced and we hope to see it through.
- Opportunities for interchange and recording of knowledge and experience of architecture: GIFA members hosted a Master Class at this year's AZA as well as participating speakers during the event, together with world renowned international architects. Members participating were:

- Interaction with other members of the building industry and the profession of architecture to enhance living: Nothing to report
- The interests of society in matters concerned with architecture in relation to the environment and a sustainable future: Nadia Tromp, GIFA President has been appointed as the Chairperson of the UIA

«Community Architecture» Work Programme. This programme focuses on 'barefoot architecture'. The 'barefoot architect' would be someone who would spend his/her energies on solving the major problems of marginal urban settlements or of villages. The chairperson has expanded this programme to include exploring the idea that architecture could be a mechanism for creating social change. Our history has led to the specific condition we currently find ourselves in. Apartheid spatial planning has left its scars on our cities. The social injustice of this planning today still affects the majority of our society. The remanence of this planning, which was designed to keep people out; to deprive the masses from accessibility to economic opportunity, education, healthcare, is a very difficult problem for designers to tackle. Architects have the power to start creating the physical change that may lead to the social change required to uplift the parts of our cities that have been neglected.



ACHIEVEMENTS BY GIFA AND GIFA MEMBERS

A: World Architecture Festival

- Last year, I was the first ever South African (and African) Female architect WAF winner. My practice, Ntsika Architects won the Category: Health Built Projects 2017.
- Last year there were only three African practices shortlisted, including Ntsika Architects. All shortlisted being from South Africa, Gauteng and GIFA members.
- Savage & Dodd Architects and

- Boogertman & Partners were both finalists.
- This year, we have this year there are 13 shortlisted from Africa – a phenomenal increase but still too few.
- There are 5 shortlisted entries from South Africa / SA based practices :
 - Savage + Dodd Architects with UrbanWorks
 - Kate Otten Architects
 - Boogertman
 - Mashabane Rose
 - Heatherwick (UK based, SA project)
- Furthermore, I am very proud that our members, Heather Dodd, Bob van Bebbber and myself have been invited as judges of the competition in Amsterdam later this year.

B: Venice Architectural Biennale 2018

- Our participation in the international arena has been phenomenal, with a number of our members participating in world recognised events. Two of our members, Peter Rich and Nadia Tromp (president) both have exhibitions of their works currently being shown at the Venice Architectural Biennale 2018. The exhibition will run until November 2018.

C: GlfA/Marley Bursary Programme

In a joint venture bursary programme between the Gauteng Institute for Architecture (GIFA) and Marley Building Systems, six deserving architectural students from the University of Johannesburg (UJ) and the University of the Witwatersrand (Wits) have been awarded bursaries to the value of R000 150.

This is the first time in the history of GIFA that this is being done, and we hope to ensure that we continue for an unforeseeable future.

There are far too many deserving students out there that have financial need and are very capable of succeeding in their academic careers.

D: Launch of our Transformation Committee

GlfA's transformation mandate is to clearly articulate ethical standards by achieving sustainable ethical culture within the architectural profession. We can achieve this by monitoring and managing programmes, guidelines and practices.

GlfA's greatest challenge currently remains SACAP.

FINANCIAL STANDING

GlfA remains to be financially challenged we hope to turn that around in our 2018-2017 fiscal year.

I request that our pool of talented members submit to us and to other competitions? I suggest that we present a CPD workshop on competitions and submissions to raise awareness amongst all our members.

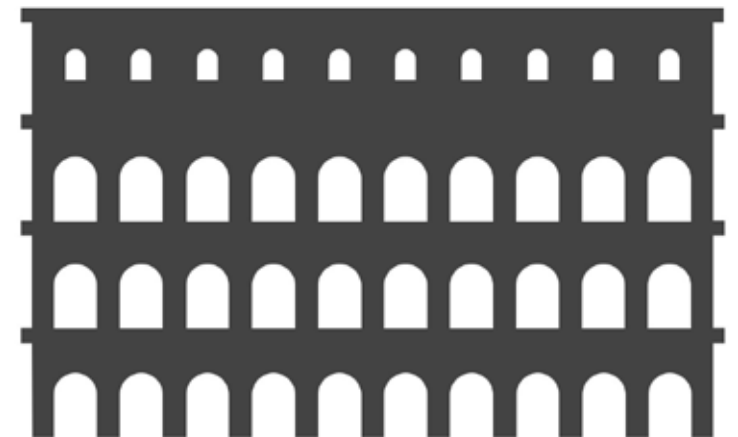

TREASURER'S REPORT

As the Incoming Treasurer, commencing the new terms of office for a new MANCOM, I and specifically GIFA have inherited some great improvements implemented by the last GIFA Mancom.

The issue of the SARS Tax

Clearance Certificate, the reconfiguration of our banking facilities and the aggressive “cut-back” initiatives to the procurement and spending protocols implemented, have greatly improved the monitoring and management of our accounts and funds. It should be noted at this stage, how GIFA is positioned financially and why.

A consistent and steady decline in membership numbers has evidently emerged over the last few years. In a thriving economy, one would expect the number of graduating and the numbers of newly certified Pr. Archs to exceed the number of retiring and lapsing members. This is not happening at the rate we require it to.

The construction industry has “bottomed out” over the last 3 years rather drastically, having a negative impact on volume of work in the sector for our profession. This is noticeable in the volume of lapsing or cancelling memberships. This shortfall in the construction sector creates an imbalance in our profession. Voluntary membership is perceived as a “luxury” more than a necessity.

The decision in 2017 not to increase membership subs and to offer incentives for early annual subscriptions, was two-fold. One to secure our current membership, and two to enlarge our membership.

The net result of these membership incentives, a stagnant & unconfident development sector and a sharp increase in the cost of everything has a knock-on effect to GIFA's financial well-being.

The silver lining is that GIFA has been pushed into the fortunate position where we now have to “Think Smart”. Every committee within GIFA has now blended into this mode of operation and the benefits are REAL. GIFA is being inventive and forward thinking.

GIFA's current financial existence relies purely on membership, events, and sponsorships. In very basic and simple terms, this money coming in, has to exceed the money going out. GIFA is now achieving this, however the pressures to "break even" are baring down on us with more ferocity than previously.

The financials show a deficit for this year **(R237.00 164)**, note that this was done up to June 2018. Membership and sponsorship income were down compared to 2017, depreciation of assets and higher operational costs compared to 2017 have impacted on our bottom line. GIFA has none-the-less hosted more seminars and events, sold more documents and maintained the full bursary program successfully. Although June indicated a shortfall, historic debt and sponsorships came through and created a strong base for our forthcoming financial year. The ongoing commitment of the GIFA office in collecting and following up on financial obligations is to be commended.

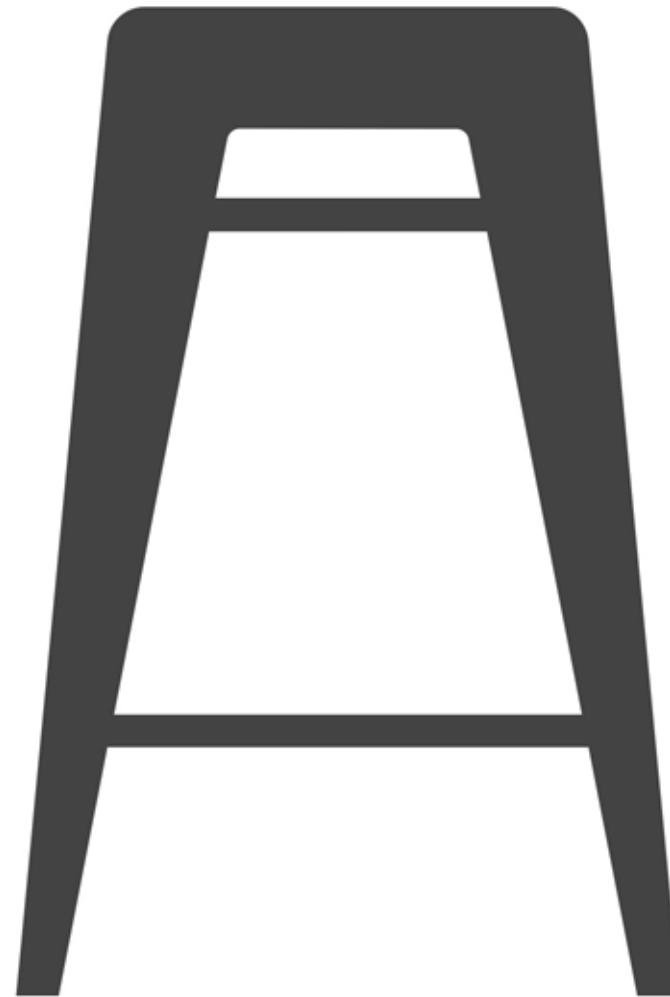

2. If the individual subscriptions were paid by the member, SAIA will refund the member.
3. The practice will indicate on the declaration form how payment for the individual was made.

Events Report

SACAP closely monitors members' CPD points and this has created a need for architects to collect their points keeping up-to-date. GlfA has hosted CPD events that are relevant to the profession, stimulating and informative. Arranging CPD points within category 1 for individuals is expensive with very few attendees to cover the cost of the CPD event. GlfA has always strived to arrange events at a reduced price by trade sharing and other means by negotiating with Presenters involved. One of the most auspicious benefit of becoming a GlfA member is the reduction of CPD event pricing, up to %50.

Tours offered this year have all been very popular such as Sasol tour, Alice lane, Dainfern square, house wise, Origins centre Rock Art Gallery and Jun Smut. More tours will be added next year to the Events Calendar as different committees will be working hand in hand with the office to bring more exciting events in house. The Professional Practice breakfasts held once a month, was well facilitated by Kuba, Jacquie Krynauw and we have seen interactions with SACAP as well as a SAIA getting involved. This year almost all our professional breakfast meetings were sponsored. Attendees enjoy the fact-to-face interaction and the opportunity to discuss relevant matters and issues affecting the profession.

Women professional breakfast was one of the informative and well attended events since 2016. Women really enjoyed it as they were given a platform to express themselves on matters that concerns women in architecture and gender. This event will be a permanent mark on our calendar as we strive to attract more women into the profession as it is perceived to be male dominant.

The young graduates curated an impressive exhibition titled 'Shaping the future of African Architecture' which has been highly received by both the public and the architectural profession.

We held 41 events in total for the year.

Going forward, GlfA will continue to strive to offer CPD events that not only maintain the relevance of the profession, but that also motivates attendees to want to collect their points because the events are inspiring and of good value.

We urge our members to get involved with CPD events, please come forward with any event you wish to present or feel that will benefit the architectural profession. We look forward to hearing from you.

For this committee 2017/2016 has been a year of dramatic changes in our practice environment. GfA's Committee initiatives have produced results in the SACAP environment (and we readily express our

gratitude also to A4C Leadership for setting examples of selfless commitment to the profession) as well as the final rebuttal of Duty of Care Agreements by both SAIA and SACAP. We have reasserted our positions as architects as leaders in the field and look forward to extending this initiative to our colleagues in other related fields and their councils and their voluntary associations.

JBCC has published its updated version 6.2 which is now available. We have close connections to JBCC. Sales are doing very well.

A recent ConCourt decision (7 June 2018) has - unfortunately - all but virtually obliterated the NBR Review Board (on which I have been a Board Member for some years). This does not mean the collapse of the NBR and its application, but of the appeal body. We are investigating ways of setting up alternatives which may reside with SALGA, or each Local Authority or its Ombudsman or a shared Ombud for the province for plan approval. We are also working with CoJ to investigate improved plan approvals. The situation seems dire but may turn out to be a blessing in disguise if a new even more suitable and direct solution is found. Please share with us ideas,

wisdoms criticisms and even complaints by mailing me directly at krynauw@krynauwnel.com. Let's vent our frustrations and speak truth to apparent power. Things must change!

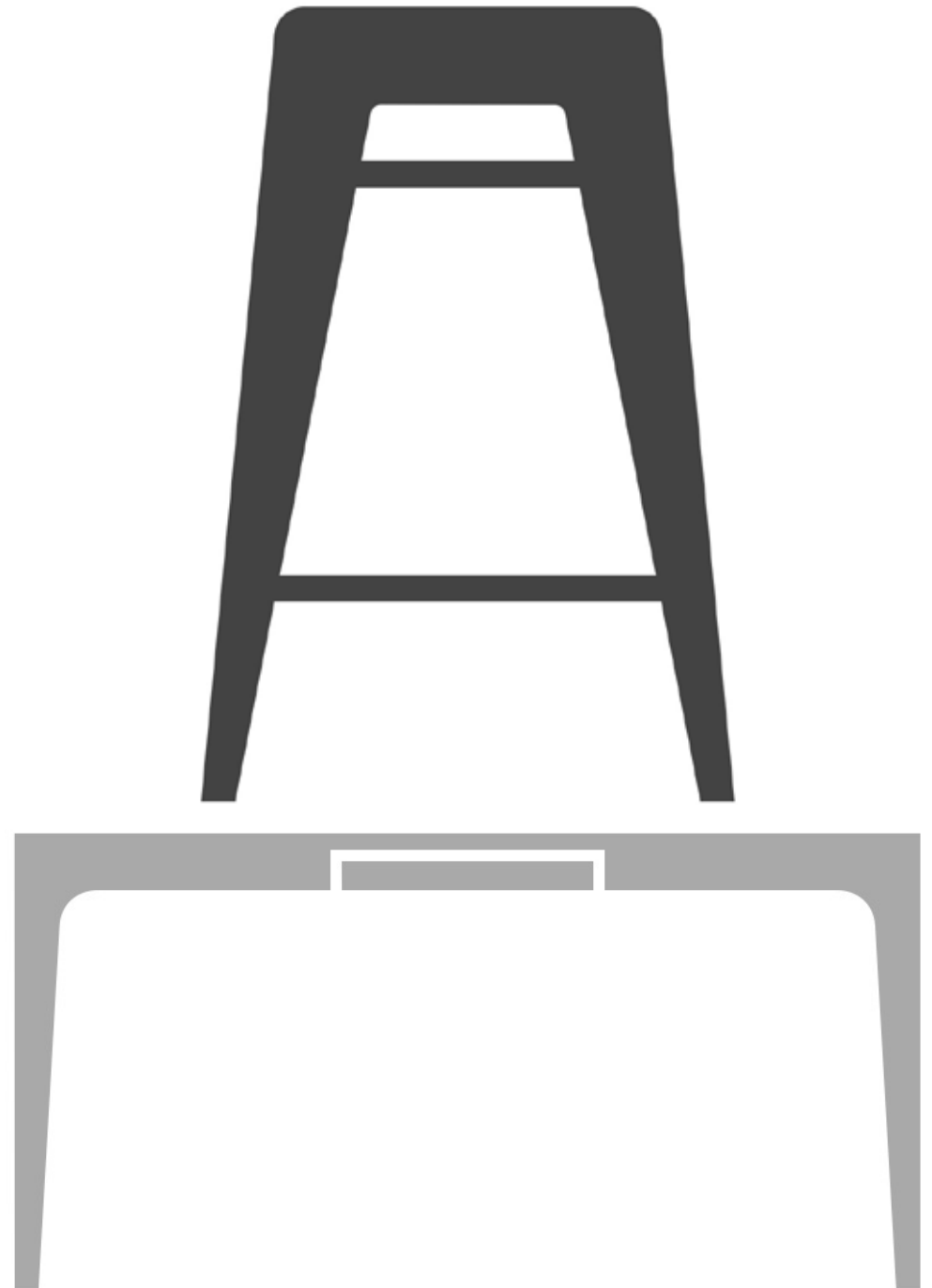

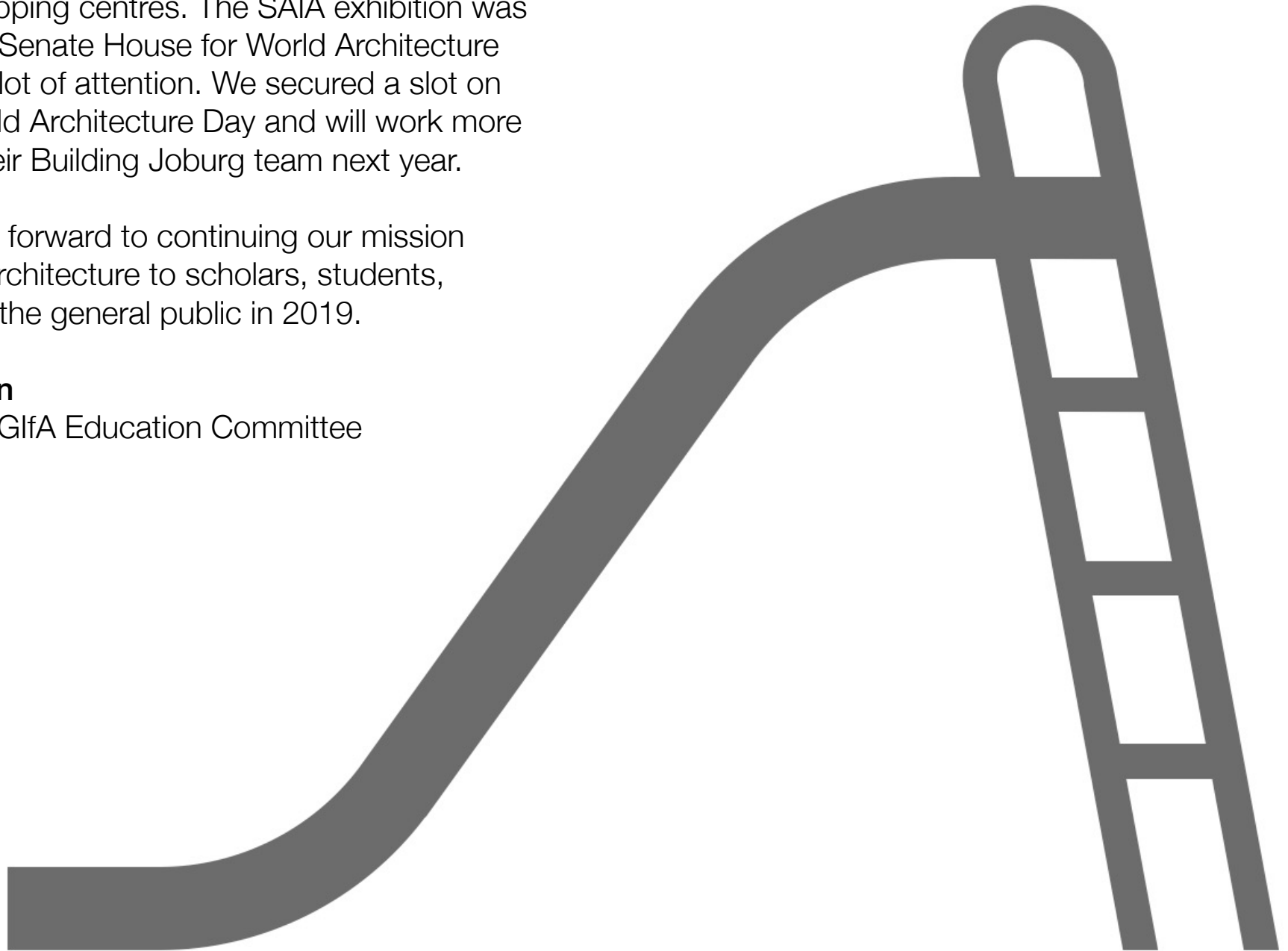

HERITAGE COMMITTEE REPORT

A lot has happened since we sat down at an empty Heritage Committee table at GlfA's Workshop in February. We were eager to assist, what transpired – largely as a result of Lenska's enthusiasm - has been a remarkable journey. First the shock and then the realisation.... we became IT. It has been a process of discovery, the meeting of remarkable people, organizations, tours, resources, portals and places. We never imagined heritage could be so broad, so current, fun and interesting.

We have been guided by GlfA's previous heritage committee activists who have imparted invaluable

knowledge, pointed us in the right direction, shared coffees and walks in the city and even given us a committee meeting space at the Rand Club. We are ever thankful for their ongoing commitment to the heritage of our city, its spaces and its people.

We are striving to understand the legal entities: SAHRA, the curator of our country's heritage and PHRA-G, Gauteng's heritage authority. The real driving forces behind our city's heritage are however the non-profit organisations and residents' associations along with a host of tour guides and interest groups. These create awareness, pride and enthusiasm for our resources, in the words of the Johannesburg Heritage Foundation, "that are precious, non-renewable, finite and irreplaceable."

We now understand that there is no need for GlfA heritage to "create" talks, walks and events, as these exist and are well established. What is missing is the "link" to GlfA's members for support, advice, collaboration and participation. We believe GlfA should consider promoting these organisations and their events to its members via its newsletters, social platforms and Instagram. Who knew for instance that we have Urban Sketchers, roof top farmers, graffiti

skateboard tours and Photo walkers. We also believe CPD accreditation of many of these should be given consideration, most of which are far more refreshing than the JBCC Contract.

In our quest for heritage knowledge we attended the Johannesburg Heritage Foundation's AGM where we gained insight and left in awe of their following, their energy and efforts. We met their chairperson Brett McDougall and have undertaken to network with him. Their mantra is heritage is a LIVING practice. It extends beyond the built environment to memory, sentiment, social history and even green heritage focusing on the trees that make our city liveable. They support the City's green warriors and collaborate with the Johannesburg Urban Forest Alliance. They also partner with #JoziWalks, a JDA initiative which "encourages Joburgers to walk their streets and engage with local communities and share insights."

31 October 2018

We aim to attending a meeting of the Joint Plans Committee of the established JHB Heritage Foundation, Parks and Westcliff Associations to gain insight on building plan heritage submissions. I was first required as a non-resident to become a member, which has now happened. Lenska will attend their

next meeting. We then hope that other GIFA members can be encouraged to assist on residents' association that lack architects or create these in areas where they don't yet exist.

Nadia highlighted the need to establish a list of Gauteng Heritage practitioners. We have established that there is an Association, APHD, with only 6 full members in Gauteng. There is also a heritage register with a large number of professionals, practices and some contractors. These are made available when enquiries arise.

We were also asked to:

- Support the Rosebank Action Group's PHRA-G heritage appeal application for Cradock Heights, Herbert Prins is awaiting a response and we
- Support Brian McKechnie, assisted by Brendan Hart, in commenting on the heritage merits of a property in Dunkeld. We have received positive feedback that GIFA's support letter served its purpose. The client accepted that the house should be retained and integrated into their new development.

These requests prompted us to obtain the "proper process and procedures" from GIFA for comment on

queries from the public or members. This we received from Nadia – thank you.

Our aim as the GlfA Heritage Committee is to be relevant by creating awareness, accessibility and interest. We strive to form a stronger LINK between Gifa members, associations, interest groups and the public. Our immediate priorities are:

- + CPD accreditation consideration of JHB tour and interest groups

- + Promoting these via the GlfA newsletters, social platforms and Instagram

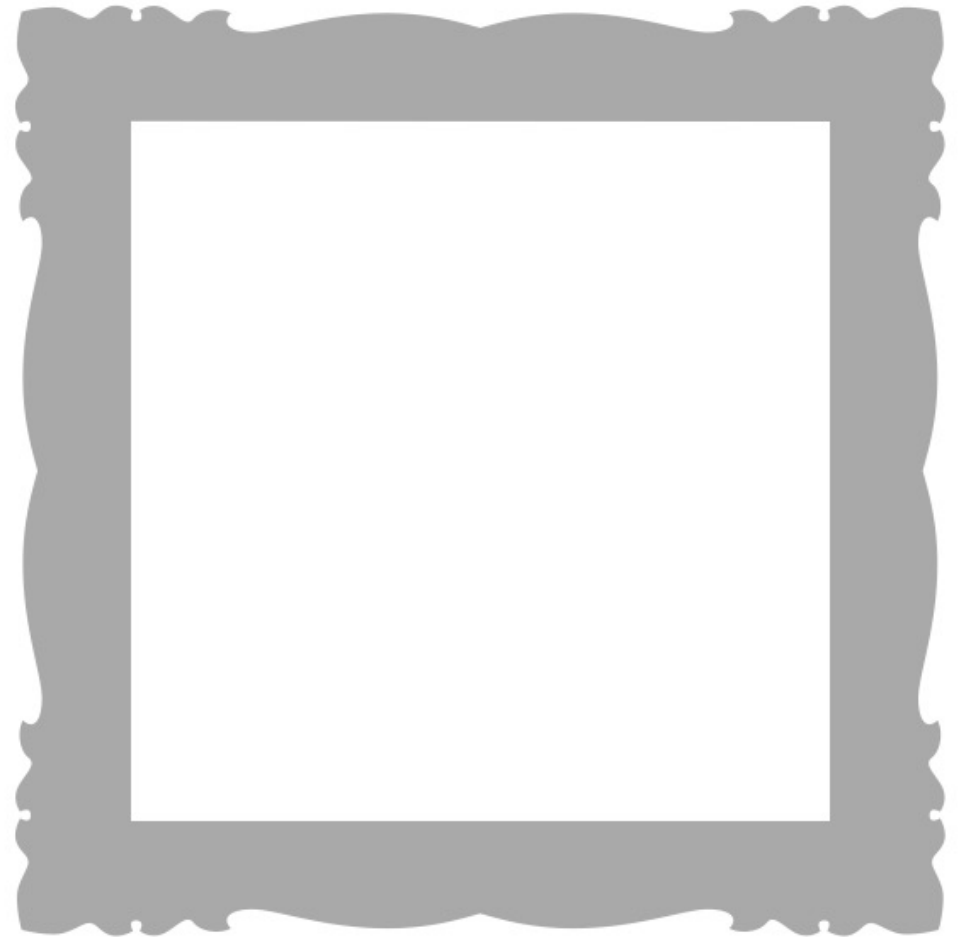

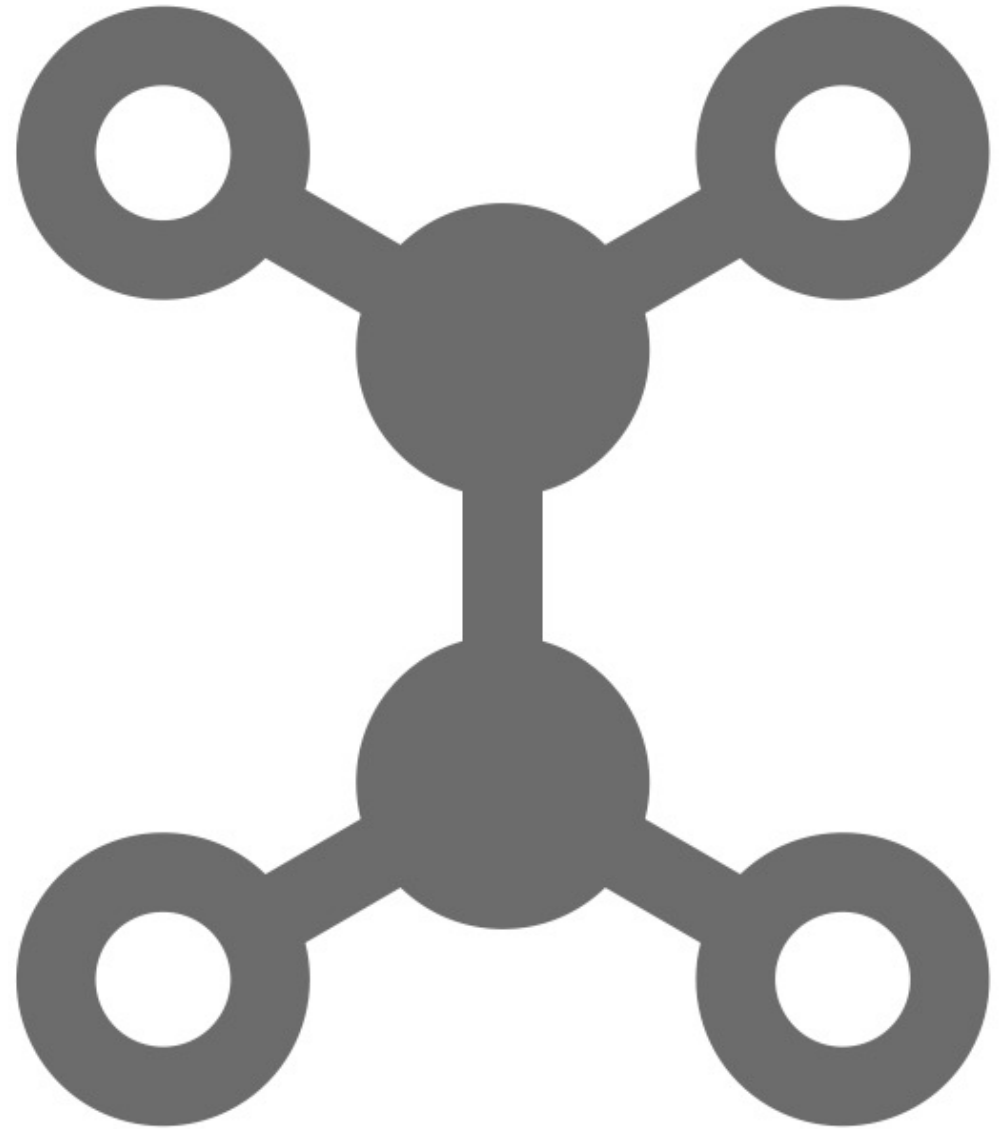

1. BASIS OF PREPARATION
