

2023 GIFA Regional Award For Architecture.

CALL FOR ENTRIES

Open to all GIFA members and members of the SAIA Regional Institutes.

Members need to submit projects to the Regional Office in the Region where the project is located.

Any member of GIFA can enter projects completed in ANY REGION for that region's awards adjudication.

You need to **be a member of GIFA or any of the SAIA regions to enter** and don't need to be a member of the region where you enter your projects.

CONDITIONS FOR ENTRY GIFA 2023 AWARDS PROJECTS, RESEARCH, OR WORK OF SOCIAL IMPORTANCE COMPLETED FROM 01 JANUARY 2021 – 31 DECEMBER 2022

Demarcation for Projects of GIFA, a Region of SAIA
The City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality
The City of Sedibeng Metropolitan Municipality
The West Rand District Municipality (the region south of the N14)
The City of Ekurhuleni Metropolitan Municipality (the region south of the N12).

1. Any paid-up member of a SAIA Regional Institute who has completed work within the GIFA region and during the period mentioned above may submit entries. More than one entry may be entered. Members of architectural practices may submit international projects to their Region.
2. The Region will appoint the regional panel of judges. The regional panel will adjudicate all entries and recommend to the committee which submissions should be awarded the

regional awards and submit these for national assessment. Having made its decision, the regional committee will prepare the assessor's report and regional citations and arrange to notify SAIA. The committee must also receive and forward any additional documentation required for national assessment by the due date.

3. Nominations must be made on the downloadable nomination/submission form (Entry Form). A separate form must be used for each nomination/submission.

4. Nomination / Submission forms for Projects, Research, or Work of Social Importance completed during 1 January 2021 - 31 December 2022 must be accompanied by the following:

4.1 A non-refundable entry fee (including VAT) to assist in defraying costs must accompany each submission. This amount is payable to GfA.

4.2 An electronic A4 brochure containing:

a. A copy of the submission form signed by the principal architect in practice. **(Where more than one practice is submitting a project for SAIA Awards, the details of all the practices must be indicated).**

b. The **client's brief** to the architectural professional(s).

c. A complete list of all the professionals/consultants and contractor(s).

d. A brief description of the project of approximately 300 words. (This should include a summary as to why this entry excels).

e. A brief comment on the project not exceeding 300 words from the user or client.

f. Consent from the client to inspect the project. (CRITICAL).

g. A locality map with clear instructions on how to reach the site, together with names and contact numbers of the project architect/architect who will be present at the site visit and the contact name of the person who can assist the panel of adjudicators in gaining access to the project during an inspection.

h. Sufficient scale drawings and photographs to adequately illustrate the project and its context: • Entrants must provide 8-12 images (drawings and photos) in electronic format. These should be a mixture of external and internal shots of the project. These images are used for judging and media purposes. They should convey and highlight what is good about the project. Both wide shots and close-ups and, if possible, show the building in use.

i. Entrants must also provide up to 8 plans in electronic format (e.g. jpegs), which must include a location plan, site plan, floor plans, elevations, and sections.

Images, file type: jpeg, quality, and size: up to 5MB in size, no less than 2MB, DPI: 300. Please note: no symbols in the naming protocol: ProjectName01PhotographerName.jpg.

4.3 2 x A1 posters to be submitted online in PDF format. 2 Sets of printed A1 laminated posters – max 2 (2 different posters) to be used during various exhibitions will be required of awarded projects.

NOTE: Project files are to be clearly marked. The above documentation will not be returned but used for adjudication and record-keeping purposes.

PLEASE NOTE:

• For projects qualifying for the SAIA 2024 Awards, all documents submitted electronically via the online GfA awards submission portal will be forwarded in the prescribed format: A4 size, **except for A1 posters which need to be printed and couriered to the address: SAIA National Office, 3rd Floor, Design District Building, Cnr Tyrwhitt & Keyes Avenues, Rosebank, Johannesburg, 2196**
